Mario received training in Respiratory and Critical Care Medicine at the University of Milan School of Medicine (Italy) and in Respiratory Research at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine (US).

During his time at the University of Miami, he served as an Assistant Professor of Medicine from 1994 to 2006.

Subsequently, he held a Tenured Professor of Medicine position at West Virginia University School of Medicine (US) from 2006 to 2010.

In 2011, Mario joined Chiesi, where he held various roles in Clinical Development. From 2011 to 2018, he served as the clinical lead for the Foster and Trimbow programs focused on asthma and COPD.

Mario transitioned to Chiesi Global Pharmacovigilance in 2019, assuming the role of Head of Risk Management Unit.

Currently, he holds the position of Senior Lead Physician for Respiratory and serves as the deputy Qualified Person for Pharmacovigilance.

Mario's research has centered on the fundamental mechanisms of airway inflammation and the impact of environmental exposure to airborne pollutants on respiratory diseases.

Since 2014, Mario has been collaborating with the Chiesi Foundation.

He currently serves as a Technical Advisor for the GASP Program in South America and Nepal and is a member of the Chiesi Foundation Board of Directors.
